

## Immigrant Ancestor, Audry Hoare, a Jamestown Bride in 1621

**Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire, United Kingdom north of London** was a lace-making town in the early 1600s. Thomas, a shoemaker, and his wife, Julayne Hoare lived in Aylesbury and had at least five children (Joan, Agnes, Elizabeth, Richard, and Audry).



Below are photos of St. Mary the Virgin Anglican church (built around 1250 AD) in Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire, United Kingdom where Audry (Adria) Hoare was baptized on 25 August 1604.



Audry's brother, Richard Hoare was apprenticed to a Fustian dresser. Fustian is a thick cloth like corduroy. The eldest married daughter, Joane Hoare Childe, lived in Blackfriars, north of the Thames River in London, a lively neighborhood for artists.

Shakespeare (1564-1616) was a shareholder in the small indoor theater, Blackfriars Theatre (built in 1596) and owned a "substantial house" in Blackfriars in 1613."

Joane Hoare Childe took her 17-year old sister, Audry Hoare to the Virginia Company for transport to Jamestown Colony in summer 1621. Source: Potter, Jennifer. *The Jamestown Brides*, 2018.
